Little Faith, Nickolas Butler — A Wisconsin family grapples with the power and limitations of faith when one of their own falls under the influence of a radical church. (Contemporary/Literary Fiction)

You Never Forget Your First, Alexis Coe — A fresh, modern look at America's first president, George Washington. Combines rigorous research and unsentimental storytelling, separating the man from the legend. (Presidential History).

The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek, Kim Michele Richardson — In 1936, Cussy Carter joins the Pack Horse Librarian Project of Kentucky. She is both welcomed as well as found suspicious by the rural folks she strives to deliver the joy of books to. (Historical Fiction)

The Pull of the Stars, Emma Donoghue — Over the course of 3 days, Nurse Julia, Doctor Kathleen, and helper Birdie, fight to save expectant mothers from a flu pandemic and shepherd new life into the world. (Fiction)

Last Days of Night, Graham Moore — New York, 1888. Young lawyer, Paul Cravath, takes on the case of Westinghouse vs. Edison: Who invented the lightbulb and holds the rights to power the country?

Can't We Talk About Something More Pleasant, Roz Chast — Roz Chast was born to late-in-life parents. This memoir is a comfort and comic relief to anyone who has experienced the life-altering loss of elderly parents. (Graphic Novel Memoir)

The Lager Queen of Minnesota, J. Ryan Stradal — A novel of Midwestern values, hard work, fate, and the secrets of making world-class beer. A deeply affecting family saga. (Fiction)

This Tender Land, William Kent Krueger — In the summer of 1932, 4 orphans flee for their lives down the Mississippi river by stolen canoe. (Historical Fiction)

The Graveyard Book, Neil Gaiman — Bod would be perfectly normal, if he didn't live in a graveyard, raised and educated by ghosts. In the land of the living lurk dangers, including the man Jack, who killed Bod's family. (Juvenile Fiction, Fantasy)

In The Dream House, Carmen Maria Machado — Selected for reading by collaboration with the Family Resource Center for Domestic Violence Awareness month. "For years Carmen Maria Machado has struggled to articulate her experiences in an abusive same-sex relationship." (Fiction)

The Sweetness at the Bottom of the Pie, Alan Bradley — In rural 1950's England, an 11 year old chemist with a penchant for poisons stumbles upon a dead body and takes it upon herself to help find the murderer. (Historical Mystery)

Winter Solstice, Rosamunde Pilcher — Five people are brought together in a large, neglected estate house in Scotland on the shortest day of the year; their lives to be changed forever. (Fiction)
